REGULATIONS, BASKETBALL

1. Time schedule. Basketball tournament will take place in Tartu from May 21 to May 23, 2010 at 9 a.m. Arrival on May 20. Technical meeting will take place on May 20 at 7 p.m. in EMU main building (Kreutzwaldi 1).

2. Program. There will be men's (max 20 teams) and women's (max 12 teams) tournament.

3. Rules. The competitions will be held according to the international (FIBA) rules with the following modifications:

3.1. The game shall consist of four (4) periods of eight (8) minutes. There shall be intervals of play of one (1) minutes between the first and second period (first half), between the third and fourth period (second half) and two (2) minutes intervals of play before extra time. There shall be a half-time interval of play of five (5) minutes.

3.2. The clock will be stopped for the free-throws and time-outs.

3.3. The principle of uninterrupted time does not apply during the last two (2) minutes of the second half-time and the extra period and the clock is stopped every time the referee interrupts the game.

3.4. If the score is tied at the end of playing time for the fourth period, the game shall continue with as many extra periods of two (2) minutes as is necessary to break the tie.

3.5. Two (2) charged time-out may be granted to each team at any time during the first half; two (2) at any time during the second half and one (1) at any time during extra period.

3.6. A team is in a team foul penalty situation when it has committed six (6) team fouls in a period.

4. Final and 3rd – 4th place game. Play time is 4 x 8 minutes, «interrupted time»

5. Number of players. The team will consist of up to 12 players.

6. Number of games. Depending on the number of participating teams, a team can play several games an day.

7. Counting. Teams will be classified according to their win-loss records, namely two (2) points for each game won, one (1) point for each game lost (including lost by default) and zero (0) points for a game lost by forfeit. In the groups the standings will be determined by the number of points (collected as described previously). In case of equality between two teams the result of the game between them is decisive. In case three or more teams gather equal number of points, better difference in points scored in the games between those teams and in case of a tie, better difference of the points scored in all games will be decisive.

8. System. The tournament is played in groups where the minimum number of teams is four (exceptionally less). If the number of teams falls in any of the groups under four (4) and if in any of the groups there are more than 4 teams, the teams are reorganized by raffing. The principle of reorganizing is that from groups with more teams than four (4), the teams are placed into groups where are less than four (4) teams. The two (2) best teams from all groups get into play-off and get the opportunity to play to place 1 to 8. The teams who can not take part in ply-off games are placed from 9th place on the results of the group games.

9. Insurance and medical service. The participants must have the appropriate insurance to cover travel and participation, as they are not the responsibility of the OC. The OC will insure the first aid at the competition venues for all the accredited persons.
