**REGULATIONS, MINI-FOOTBALL**

**1. Time schedule.** Mini-football tournament will be held from May 21 to May 23, 2010, on Annelinna Stadium (Artificial grass!) starting at 10 a.m. Technical meeting will take place on May 20 at 7 p.m. in accreditation centre.

**2. Program.** Men's and women's competitions will be held. Maximum number of teams for men is 24 and for women is 8.

**3. Rules.** Official FIFA regulations will be used with the following modifications:

**3.1.** The size of the field is half of normal size.

**3.2.** Playtime is 2 x 15 minutes for men and women, half-time lasts 3 minutes.

**3.3.** There are no restrictions as for exchange of players.

**3.4.** The player is allowed to leave and enter the game only from the frontline of the field (this means a zone nearby the goal).

**3.5.** If there is a breach of regulation, then the player will be given a yellow card.

**3.6.** Red card means that the player is not allowed to play in this game any more and the team will play in minority until end of game.

**3.7.** Red card means also, that the player can not participate in the next game.

**3.8.** Two yellow cards given to the same player in one game automatically means getting the red card and player can not participate in the next game.

**3.9.** If there will be a tie in playoffs, the winner is decided by kicking penalties (both teams will kick 3 penalties, if there will be still a tie to the first miss).

**4. Number of players in a team.** The team consists of up to 14 players. There will be 7 players on the field at a time (6 on field + 1 goalkeeper).

**5. Number of games.** Depending on the number of participating teams a team can play several games a day.

**6. Counting.** Teams will be classified according to their win-loss records, namely three (3) points for each game won, one (1) point for each game tie and zero (0) points for a game lost or lost by forfeit. In the pools level of the competition standings will be determined by the number of points (collected as described previously). In case of equality the number of forfeit is first criteria. Equality between two teams, the result of the game between them is decisive. In case three or more teams gather equal number of points, the difference of goals in the games between these teams, and in case of a tie, better difference of the goals in total, will be decisive. The next criteria are total number of goals and last resort is a die.

**7. System.** It has been decided to play in pools and to apply the round-system. There will be 4-6 teams in each pool. According to the results in pools, the best 2-3 teams will continue playing in the play-off system.

**8. Insurance and medical service.** The participants must have the appropriate insurance to cover travel and participation, as they are not the responsibility of the OC. The OC will insure the first aid at the competition venues for all the accredited persons.
